## OVER 6 MILLION SERVED

## A United Effort to Care for Ghana's Orphans

Being a kid is tough, even in the best conditions. Kids with two loving parents and grandparents to spoil them still have to fight their own fights, face unavoidable hardships. Consider, then, the world's orphans: Two strikes against them through no fault of their own. "These children are just like [I was]," says Naomi, who grew up on the streets in Ghana before founding the Royal Seed Home, which cares for 150 kids. "They grow up outside society and they have no social protection. We all have the same story."

AmeriCares' One Child One World™ program has joined forces with Naomi's and 29 other homes that provide for 1,800 Ghanaian orphans. One Child One World delivers basics like nutrition and hygiene products.

A preliminary study found these kids are twice as likely as other Ghanaian children to be underweight, so the partnership with XANGO was a perfect fit. To date, more than half a million XANGO Meal Pack meals have delivered essential vitamins, minerals and calories to the country's orphans.

Thanks to XANGO, they have food. Thanks to AmeriCares, their caretakers have the resources to create a clean, safe childhood. And thanks to people like Naomi, they have loving support that gives them a fighting chance — something every kid, everywhere deserves. Their story is our story.



## Goodness for XANGO Goodness' Sake



Walk into stores and restaurants scattered in communities throughout 10 central and southern U.S. states, and you may see a small container sitting on the counter, inviting you to donate your extra change to help feed the hungry. Those receptacles were put in place by XANGO 100Ks John & Gina Jurewicz and members of their team, folks who are dedicated to helping others and are always looking for ways to do more.

"We tithe at our church, provide monthly support through various organizations for several children living in underdeveloped countries, and have contributed to digging water wells in communities desperate for water," says Gina. "But that wasn't enough. We wanted to be involved in a perpetual giving process that would provide assistance month after month and truly make a difference."

John agrees, adding this startling statistic: "Did you know that every six seconds, somewhere in the world, a child dies of starvation? We are passionate about getting food and water to those who need it, and partnering with the XANGO Goodness Foundation and the Meal Pack program provided the opportunity we were looking for," he explains.

Before setting up the containers, John and Gina had sent XANGO Meal Packs with a pastor on their team who served a mission trip to Kenya. When he returned with stories of how much the Meal Packs meant (some people walked for days to receive them), the Jurewiczes knew they could do more. "We had the right food, we just needed the method," Gina observes. "We recognized that individual people were limited in what they could donate every month, so we wanted to get the masses involved in order to make a significant difference."

The couple, along with team member Janet Kroll, started placing collection boxes at various businesses and were encouraged by the response: In their first month they collected enough to donate 40 meals. As a side benefit, their efforts became a way to build their XANGO business. They began sharing their idea with their team members, many of whom joined in the effort.

"We started to expand as more and more people got involved," says John. "I'm not sure how many Meal Packs in total are ordered through our organization — I know it's a lot — but I know that in the past three years, just Gina and I, along with Janet, have collected enough to purchase and donate more than 20,000 meals. We never could have done that alone!"

In addition to making a difference in the world, team members who are joining these efforts are gaining valuable personal skills and confidence and finding increased opportunities to share the XANGO products and business with those they come in contact with.

John and Gina do all they can to make it simple for team members to get involved in the efforts, including providing sources for the displays, containers, and inserts, plus holding weekly calls to provide guidance and support to those involved. They also regularly print certificates to present to the businesses that house their collection containers; the certificates include the number of meals that have been donated. "We think it's important to recognize the owners and let them see the difference they are making by having the collection boxes in their businesses," John explains.

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Through their efforts, John and Gina are not just helping starving people in third-world countries; they're also sharing the XANGO opportunity, both the wellness benefits and the business potential. "We've been XANGO distributors for more than 10 years," offers Gina, "and we can't even begin to explain the difference it has made in our lives."

The couple learned about the XANGO opportunity after responding to a generic promotion on the radio. At that time in their lives they were looking for financial stability: John had just lost his job as a mechanic, and when Gina had asked if she could add health insurance to her benefits as a hair stylist, she was told she had to wait for open enrollment — and then was demoted to a part-time position and became ineligible for insurance, as well as losing holiday pay and guaranteed hours.

"We were tired of letting other people determine our destiny," Gina says. "We wanted to take control of our lives and find some security that we hadn't ever experienced, and we knew it wouldn't be fixing cars and hair." XANGO provided the opportunity to do that, and as an added bonus, the couple began feeling better as well. In addition to increased energy levels and better general health, John's chronic sinus infections and colds disappeared while Gina's persistent periodontal and skin problems improved.

"We couldn't have any of this — better health, improved financial security, plus an opportunity to serve others and make a difference in the world — without XANGO and our incredible team," John concludes. "We've got what we need, and we're able to help feed the starving. We are just thankful to be doing what we're doing." 🌱

## LOOKING BACK AT TYPHOON HAIYAN



When the largest typhoon on record devastated areas in the Philippines, XANGO Distributors sprang into action. Through our partners at AmeriCares, a shipment of Meal Packs landed in Tacloban within days of the storm, offering a lifeline at the most critical point in the recovery, when so many were forced to begin again.

Now, almost a year after Haiyan made landfall, we can take stock of exactly how generous XANGO Distributors like you actually were: Through AmeriCares, XANGO delivered tens of thousands of meals in the weeks that followed. That's tens of thousands of people who — though they were hurt, grieving and newly homeless — had a full belly as they began to rebuild. With so many crops destroyed and delivery routes cut off by the storm, a bowl of porridge became the difference between despair and hope.

In total, AmeriCares donated \$8 million in supplies to the recovery effort. A staggering, humbling number. Be proud of what you've given and remember the real impact it has for real people in real need. There are faces and bellies and hearts at the end of every Meal Pack we ship in your name.
